Mendoza, Argentina

The XVI Conference of Defense Ministers of the Americas (CDMA) concluded with the signing of the Mendoza Declaration by Argentine Defense Minister Luis Petri. Held in Mendoza from October 12–16, 2024, the conference brought together representatives from 34 countries across the hemisphere. The Inter-American Defense College had the privilege of participating in this important event, providing an opportunity to engage with senior defense leaders, including some of our distinguished alumni.

Dr. Duran is a full professor of pedagogy at the Brazilian Army and works at the Ministry of Defense. With a doctorate in education, postdoctoral studies in Military Sciences, and numerous specializations, she is committed to continuous learning. She believes professionals are always evolving, which motivates her to pursue further studies.

Having lived in Brazil and Guatemala, she values intercultural experiences as essential for forming strategic leaders. Her academic interests include defense culture, strategic leadership, military education, and cognitive warfare. She is researching the effects of hyperconnectivity, AI, and social media on public opinion and decision-making, as well as new security threats in the Hemisphere.

Dr. Duran views interculturality, interdisciplinarity, and hemispheric cooperation as vital for addressing geopolitical challenges. At the IADC, she believes the diversity of people and institutions strengthens ties among American countries and fosters critical thinking to develop comprehensive solutions to shared challenges in the international arena.
